# <u>PKA-Funded Environmental/Wildlife Panel Upgrade on Johnson Beach</u>

In keeping with its education purpose, the Perdido Key Association contributed to an upgrade of three interpretive wayside panels near the Perdido Key Discovery Trail at the Perdido Key Area of the Gulf Islands National Seashore (Johnson Beach). The December 8, 2017 "Gulf Islands News" release stated (in part): "Several interpretive wayside panels were recently upgraded and installed at the national seashore's Perdido Key Area thanks to the Perdido Key Association (PKA). The wayside panels and some associated hardware had weathered badly since it was first installed. The PKA approached the National Park Service earlier this year to provide financial support for the upgrade. 'We are grateful to the Perdido Key Association for their generous donation in support of the national seashore,' said Superintendent Dan Brown. 'Interpretive wayside panels are a critical tool of the National Park Service to share the important stories of the national seashore.' At Perdido Key these waysides interpret the natural beauty and dynamic wildlife of the area, provide trail guidance and safety reminders, and tell the story of important figures like Rosamond Johnson."
