Perdido Key Issues

A Terrible Accident on Perdido Key Drive

Eight pedestrians were injured, with some injuries reported as life-threatening, in a single vehicle accident on Perdido Key Drive at about 8:15 PM Saturday, April 29, 2017. According to the WKRG news report at http://wkrg.com/2017/04/29/perdido-key-crash-leaves-eight-hospitalized/, the pedestrians were hit from behind while walking along the road.

More information on the accident and the condition of the injured was not available when this Key Note was released.

County Moving Toward Beachfront Purchase

At its April 6, 2017 regular meeting, the Escambia County Board of County Commissioners approved a recommendation to complete all necessary County requirements to purchase the beach front parcel at 14777 Perdido Key Drive that might provide additional public beach access. The property is between Beach Access #3 and the east end of Perdido Key State Park near where River Road meets Perdido Key Drive. The purchase could expand the beach access and parking available for day use of our wonderful Perdido Key beaches.

Dune Restoration Project Approved!

With agreement from 84% of beach front property owners, Escambia County will be going forward with the Perdido Key Dune Restoration Project to plant sea oats and other appropriate vegetation on Peridido Key dunes. Planting should begin in November 2017. On its website, the County thanked participating owners and noted that it can now receive funding for the project.

Florida House Leaves Perdido Key Off Beach Funding Goals

The April 5, 2017 article "Florida House pulls back on \$50 million funding goal" by Ryan Mills and Arek Sarkissian in the Naples News Journal reported that the Florida House of Representatives has "skipped over a Perdido Key beach project in Escambia County" in favor of other projects in its latest beach funding proposal. Representative Gaetz Drops Request for Navarre Pass

District 1 Congressmen Matt Gaetz has reportedly dropped the request to reopen Navarre Pass from his proposed legislation to allow private ownership of property on Pensacola Beach and Navarre Beach. According to the April 17, 2017 article "Gaetz: Reopening Navarre Pass on hold for now" in the Pensacola News Journal, Gaetz said that "reopening the pass would have to wait because of concerns from Eglin Air Force Base leaders that increased recreational boat traffic would disrupt important amphibious assault training by special forces and missile testing on a 20-mile stretch of military-owned beach adjacent to the proposed pass." Revised Hurricane Reentry Procedures

According to personnel at the Perdido Key Visitors Center, passes for return to Perdido Key after a hurricane are no longer being issued. To regain entry following evacuation from future storms, owners will need to visit the nearest FEMA station and show a local drivers license or other proof of ownership of Perdido Key property. The FEMA station will then issue appropriate instructions on when and how to gain access to property.

Perdido Kids Park Now Open

Following repairs and upgrades, the Perdido Kids Park at 1004 Gulf Beach Highway has been reopened.
