## **Proposed New District for Perdido Key**

The October 05, 2021 joint meeting of the Escambia County Board of County Commissioners and Escambia County School Board members approved a first draft of new district boundaries that moves Perdido Key and the Innerarity peninsula from District 2 to District 1. Commissioners and School Board members will meet again on Tuesday, November 2, 2021, beginning at 5:01 PM, at the Escambia County Government Complex, 221 Palafox Place, to finalize the draft. ## **Escambia County Government Change Proposal**

A group of "business leaders, former public officials and concerned citizens" are working to change Escambia County's form of government to a "charter county," i.e., one with

"broader self-government powers" than the current form. The group will make its proposal at the Escambia County Board of County Commissioners "Committee as a Whole" meeting on Tuesday, November 9, 2021, beginning at 9:00 AM. With more than 50% of respondents in the 2020 Perdido Key Property Owner Survey in favor of pursuing Perdido Key incorporation, county governance change proposals should be followed closely. # Perdido Key Beach Access #4

Construction has begun on the new beach access location just east of the Crab Trap restaurant on Perdido Key. According to an Escambia County news release, the new site will have a "permeable concrete parking lot with 35 parking spots, installation of an ADA-compliant AccessMat dune walkover and educational signage about protected wildlife." As a designated Perdido Key beach mouse habitat, the site will have fencing to "prevent pedestrian and vehicular trespass on protected habitat areas." # **Concrete Utility Poles on River Road**

Gulf Power is replacing several wooden utility poles along River Road with concrete ones. According to an April 2021 Gulf Power news release about an earlier pole replacement along Jackson Street: "Concrete poles are wind-rated at 140 mph and have a longer lifespan than wood poles, which will help during storm season to reduce the number of outages."
