## **PKA Annual Membership Meeting February 25**

The Estuary Program works toward "improving and maintaining the natural habitat and ecosystem of the bays, estuaries and watersheds of Pensacola and Perdido Bays." PKA members should receive the mail-out package for the meeting shortly. Please RSVP if planning to attend but also send in the enclosed proxy to ensure there is a quorum for the meeting. The mailing also contains information on renewing your PKA membership for 2023 – we hope you will continue to join us as we work through the challenges to our area.

## **Perdido Incorporation Meeting**

At least 300 people attended the January 23, 2023 "We are Perdido" community meeting on incorporation at Liberty Church on Blue Angel Parkway. Featured was Florida League of Cities Director of FLC University Lynn Tipton who provided detailed information on the process of incorporation, types of municipalities that could result, potential benefits and pitfalls, plus many other relevant topics. "We are Perdido" leader Steven Brendtro then gave a report on the status of their "Government Lite" Perdido incorporation process including its rapid timeline where a go-ahead from local state political leaders had already been granted and a feasibility study was in progress and expected to be submitted to the Florida legislature by September 1, 2023. Along the way will be community meetings of various sorts. If approved by the legislature and Florida governor in 2024, incorporation could be on the ballot for voters in the Perdido area in the November 2024 general election. ## **Perdido Bay Boat Ramp Approved**

The Escambia County Board of County Commissioners approved a \$4.2 million contract to build a new boat ramp on Perdido Bay. With access from Lillian Highway, the ramp will be funded through the RESTORE Act (BP penalty funds), National Resources Damage Assessment funds and Escambia County's American Rescue Plan Act funds. The new facility will feature 62 parking spaces for vehicles with boat trailers and 22 standard parking spaces. #### **Record Tourism Year for Pensacola Area**

Visit Pensacola reported more than 2.5 million visitors came to Pensacola between October 2021 and September 2022, spent more that \$1.3 billion and provided \$21.8 million for Escambia County's Tourist Development Tax – a 23.5% increase in revenue. ### **Warrington Middle School**

Progress continues toward transitioning Warrington Middle School to a charter school, a move made necessary by repeated low scores in state evaluations. If current expectations are sustained, Charter Schools USA will have a new agreement with the Escambia County School Board by the beginning of the July 1, 2023 school year. The grades to be taught at the school and geographic area from which students will be drawn are among important decisions yet to be made. Current teachers at Warrington Middle School can be reassigned within the district and may also apply for positions with the charter institution but would forfeit their district employment. #### **More on Fish Farms**

As presented in an earlier Key Notes, an industrial-scale fish farm in the Gulf of Mexico is being proposed for the Pensacola area. In a memorandum from Christian Wagley of Healthy Coast: "A New York company has applied for permits to setup an industrial-scale fish farm about 25 miles offshore from Perdido Key that would raise over 5 million pounds of fish annually. Fish farms similar to this one have caused pollution and harm to wild fish in many areas around the world." A fish farm proposed near Siesta Key and Sarasota has been opposed by government and non-governmental groups and is currently being challenged in court. ### **Oyster Harvesting Limited**

Because of rising bacteria levels and associated contamination, in mid-January 2023 Florida's Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services extended the areas of "Pensacola, Escambia, Blackwater Bay and adjacent East Bay where farming and harvesting oysters was prohibited." Christian Wagley of Healthy Gulf noted that he and others have "pushed local officials for quick action to find the cause of the increase in bacterial contamination and solutions that will eventually allow these areas to reopen to harvest."
