September 18 Commissioner Bergosh Town Hall

Escambia County District 1 Commissioner Jeff Bergosh held a Town Hall at the Perdido Bay United Methodist Church on September 18, 2023 with perhaps 100 people attending. A number of other local officials participated including Assistant County Administrator Debbie Bowers as well as Bruce Wood from ECUA. Among the issues covered by Traffic Engineer Chris Phillips were concerns about the roundabout at the Perdido Key Drive/Johnson Beach Road intersection and the traffic backups it may be causing. The roundabout is small because of land use restrictions and requires substantial caution in its use. The county has collected additional information on traffic flow at the intersection using remote cameras and continues to investigate what changes if any, such as bypasses, should be made to improve traffic flow while ensuring safety. Other traffic issues discussed were concerns about traffic increase from the Altura apartment complex at the north end of Theo Baars Bridge; plans and proposals for improvements to Sorrento Road; and, a new traffic light on Sorrento Road at the entrance to the Perdido Bay County Club area to be completed by about November 1, 2023. Because of audience questions, another issue discussed at considerable length was the "We Are Perdido" proposal for incorporation. While stating his neutrality on the issue, Commissioner Bergosh noted his belief that increased property owner fees would be necessary. Other information provided was the River Road closure for culvert replacement was postponed to mid-October 2023 with construction to be completed in February 2024; construction of the new Perdido Bay boat ramp off Lillian Highway was 25% complete and would be done by March 2024; construction of the Perdido Key Multi-Use Path was going well and would be completed by June 2024. Commissioner Bergosh signaled his support for a rewrite of the county's land development code along with requiring public notification of large apartment complex construction as well as some form of developer infrastructure responsibility such as concurrency. He also supports underground utilities for Perdido Key and is investigating means to fund the conversion. Beach Access locations #2 and #3 will likely be getting new parking area surfaces but lose their restroom buildings – shifting to portable units like Beach Access #4 – and creating a few more parking areas. The Commissioner discussed his support for more beach access areas and parking, including the 75 ft public access easement apparent for some Perdido Key beachfront properties - an issue popular with the audience [note a

Perdido Key Beach Cleanup

The Perdido Key Association, Friends of Pensacola State Parks and Florida State Park rangers hosted International Coastal Cleanup Day on Saturday, September 16, 2023 at the Perdido Key State Park West Use Area. Over 50 volunteers helped cleanup our beaches including very active participation from 10 students from Pensacola Catholic High School. Trash removed included large debris remaining from Hurricane Sally. T-shirts unique to the event were distributed to all participants. It was a great community effort to improve beach environment!

Baptist Hospital Moves to New Facility

Baptist Hospital moved from its E Street location on September 23-24 to an impressive new facility at the intersection of I-110 and Brent Lane. Patients were transferred in carefully orchestrated groups of three ambulances. Concerns remain about the fate of the old facility that had provided an anchor for its surrounding neighborhoods for many years, though it was recently revealed that "Pensacola is in active talks to secure an agreement with Baptist Health Care for the donation of the old Baptist Hospital campus to the city in exchange for paying for the demolition of the old hospital." Beach vitex is a very persistent invasive species that continues to threaten local areas, so this year Escambia County is targeting vitex removal from Pensacola Beach. Here are several Halloweed volunteer opportunities: Oct 4 meet at Quietwater Boardwalk near the seashell; Oct 12 meet on bike path near the Sugar Bowl at Parking Lot 27A; Oct 18 meet at sewer lift station on Via DeLuna just west of the west entrance to Sugar Bowl; and, Oct 25 meet on bike path near Portofino at parking Lot 27B. All

efforts will begin at 12 PM; bring gloves, loppers or clippers and a 5-gallon bucket.
